

Big changes are on the horizon for the Hickory Museum of Art. The museum is officially moving forward with its long-planned renovation. This exciting step is possible because of the success of the "Uncrate the Future" Capital Campaign, a community-driven effort that has already reached a remarkable milestone. And while much has been accomplished, the campaign isn't over—HMA continues to raise funds to strengthen its long-term sustainability and ensure a bright future for the arts in our region. #### **Transforming the First Floor**

What is now the Education Wing will soon become a state-of-the-art Collection Storage and Artwork Receiving Area. A new addition at the back of the building will create a private, secure, climate-controlled space where artwork can safely arrive. This change means more storage, better efficiency, and modern systems to protect the collection. From the moment a crate is delivered to the time a piece is installed in the galleries, the new setup will give the museum the stability and access it needs to bring in exhibitions that weren't possible before.



#### **A New Education Wing Upstairs**

Education is moving up—literally. The second floor will house four new classrooms, each equipped with advanced technology and connected directly to the galleries. By moving classrooms upstairs, the museum will be able to welcome more students while also making visits safer and smoother. The design supports 21st-century learning and keeps the Education Wing closely tied to the art on display.



#### A Reimagined Third Floor

The third floor will take on a whole new role as the center for staff and leadership. Offices will be designed for collaboration and growth, but the standout features are a brand-new Boardroom and catering kitchen. The Boardroom will give trustees and committees a dedicated space to meet, plan, and look ahead to the museum's future. The catering kitchen will open the door for more receptions, rentals, and community events—making the museum not just a place to view art, but also a place to gather. Together, these additions will make the third floor a hub for both behind-the-scenes work and community connection.

The renovation officially began on September 2, 2025. Just before the work got underway, the community came together for a special "Closing the Gates" celebration on Sunday, August 31 at 4 PM. Friends and families gathered to hear remarks from Mayor Hank Guess, share light refreshments, and take part in a meaningful ceremony. As part of the event, Mayor Guess had the honor of lowering the museum's gates for the last time before construction began—a gesture that closed one chapter and opened the door to HMA's next.



## RANDOM ACTS OF ARTSINESS



MAKE MUSIC day began 43 years ago in France. Fête De La Musique, meaning both "festival of music" and "make music" in French, was created as a free music festival where anyone could play music or host performances. The event took place on the summer solstice, June 21 and has become a national holiday. According to <a href="makemusicday.org">makemusicday.org</a>, almost 11% of French people (7 million) have performed in the festival, and

The holiday has since spread throughout the world and on June 21, 2025, 5,471 free events took place – including four in Catawba County!

64% (43 million) come out each year to listen.





Golden Rule Music School and Hickory Music Factory co-produced a Community Showcase in Downtown Hickory. NoCo Arts organized a Walk-About around the square in downtown Newton and a Street Jam session took place in Yount Park. AnandaRasa hosted a Community Drum Circle and Solstice Fire Ceremony at Catawba Farms. All of these events were free to the public and many of them called for amateurs to join in.

On June 30, 2025, just a few days after Make Music Day, The World Health Organization released a report that confirms social isolation and loneliness are widespread with serious but under-recognized impacts on health. The report also defines social well-being as being just as important as physical and mental well-being.

I hope that you will think about joining Make Music Day next year on June 21, 2026 – or better yet, don't wait! Sharing musical experiences, whether participating or listening, can foster a sense of community and belonging. Events like Make Music Day and other impromptu jam sessions and concerts are just the sort of random acts of artsiness we need to build social connections that will make our lives better.
